Speaking of members: A big thank you to the 35 families who joined in August! That brings our membership total to 379—still a way to go from our goal of 500 members out of 934 homes in Foxridge.

Wondering if \$60 a year is worth it? Read on!

To HOA or Not to HOA?

In her article Colorado Homeowners Grapple with Significant Hidden Costs, former Denver Post editor and freelance writer Sara B. Hansen highlights the growing prevalence and cost of Homeowners Associations (HOAs).

Citing a recent Bankrate study, Hansen notes:

"Homeowners Associations (HOAs) are becoming increasingly common, with 40.5% of listings in HOA communities in 2024, up from 39.2% in 2023, according to research by Realtor.com. HOA fees are also getting more expensive, with the median monthly fee increasing from \$100 to \$125."

Here in Foxridge, we are not governed by an HOA. Instead, we have the Foxridge Improvement Association (FIA)—a Civic Association that is voluntary, affordable, and community-driven. What are the differences?

Many families move to Foxridge specifically to avoid HOA restrictions and fees—yet they still enjoy many of the benefits that come from FIA efforts, regardless of membership. The only exception? Dumpster Day+, a favorite event that remains exclusive to FIA members.

Every year, the FIA crafts its budget based on projected dues and donations. As summer unfolds, we often debate whether we can afford a second Dumpster Day in the fall. And more often than not, we take the leap—hoping the event itself will encourage a few more households to join.

This year is no different. While we've welcomed **35 new members** in August, we're still well short of our goal: **500 members out of 934 homes**.

GID/Landscape September Update

Landscape Maintenance

Summer cleanup continues with trash and debris removal, weed control, pruning, and entry garden maintenance. Fall cleanup will begin as needed.

Holly Entrance

Erik Sutton has added irrigation and is making plans to replace vegetation at the east end of the Holly island near King Soopers. Last year, shrubs were damaged by snow removal trucks.

Tree Pruning

In mid-August, trees along Mineral Avenue, Quebec Street, County Line Road, and a couple of other GID areas were pruned to clear the GID fences by at least 2 feet. Branches were also trimmed to provide 8 to 10 feet of clearance above sidewalks and 18 to 20 feet above the roadway. Dead and damaged limbs were also removed.

September 18	Submit candidate name, photo and biography to appear in the October Foxtales
September 20	Final cutoff date to be listed on the ballot – must submit candidate name, photo, and biography
October 1	All certified FIA members receive a mailed ballot that can be returned by mail or in person at the annual meeting. (NOTE: Homeowners may join and ask for a ballot anytime up to and including, at the November 13th annual meeting.)
November 12	Annual meeting and announcement of initial election results; final verification occurs in the days that follow. The annual meeting is open to all FIA members. Ballots may be cast at the meeting if they have not been mailed ahead of time.

Autumn Planting for Spring Color

The recent cold snap and snow gave many Coloradoans the idea it was time to clean and hang up the gardening tools for the season. If you are ready for the nip of cold in the air and mugs full of chill-chasing cocoa, that may be the case. For those of you who aren't quite ready to hang up the gardening gloves, you may be able to squeeze in a bit more planting. While above-ground temperatures may be dropping, it takes longer for in-ground temperatures to freeze, making autumn a good time to plant for the upcoming spring season. To some, there is something special about seeing blooms of color either popping up through the snow or within a dormant landscape in early spring. Spring gardening in Colorado can be a challenge but with planning and appropriate plant and bulb selection this fall, you too can create something special in your own home landscape.

Planning is key to gardening any time of year but especially when looking ahead to the next season. One approach is to ask yourself 2 questions: What kinds of spring-blooming plants grow well in our zone 5 climate and appeal to you? Secondly, where should they be planted for the best chance for success and blooms? There are a variety of bulbs that can thrive in Colorado's climate and can be planted from mid-September to late October. These include: Tulips • Hyacinths • Daffodils • Crocus • Snowdrops • Alliums • Irises

With planning, many of these bulbs and plants can produce color and blooms from early March through late June. Popular plants that can provide seasonal color from fall to spring are the blooms of pansies also known as violas. Violas typically can have up to three different colors in their flowers. The combination of bulbs and violas can provide color and interest in areas where foliage and blooms are dormant.

Keep in mind the more suitable the site, the best chance the bulbs and plants will last in the garden. Once you've selected the types of plants to grow, deciding where to place them in your garden will be the second task. Most spring-blooming bulbs and plants will prefer the cooler soil but sunnier sites in your landscape. Sandy and clayey sandy soil will be suitable for most of these fall-planted blooms. Once the weather starts to heat up and other foliage springs back to life, many of these plants will begin to give way to warmer season varieties and other plants requiring hotter temperatures. One thing to keep in mind is that wherever they are planted, provide them the soil, space and light they will need to grow. Are you curious which types of plants are best suited for your area? Take a look at the plants recommended by Plant Select. Plant Select is a resource that can help you choose plants that are known to thrive in specific areas.


