Foxridge Enhancements -

One more major project to go – Foxridge Pickleball and Tennis


Several projects over the last few years have enhanced Foxridge with direct and indirect benefits for all residents.


- The new GID community fence replaced a decaying and dilapidated fence resulting in an updated and fresh
 look along our main thoroughfares. There are direct benefits to homeowners adjacent to those fences and
 indirect benefits for the rest of us who appreciate the new look. This was a property tax-based project through
 the Foxridge General Improvement District.
- The community garden, originally started via the Foxridge Improvement Association and turned over to a
 separate committee in collaboration with Denver Urban Gardens, is an amazing asset that is open to all. A
 short on-site orientation is all that's needed to learn the lock code so you can volunteer and/or enjoy the
 garden whenever you'd like.
- 3. South Suburban has completed several projects related to playgrounds, irrigation, and landscaping great improvements!

One last major project could be a capstone for Foxridge, making our community surpass many of those around us in desirability. Foxridge Swim and Racquet Club originated over 40 years ago through the efforts of caring homeowners who wanted to create a recreational amenity for the neighborhood. Many years later, the Club is regularly challenged to stretch current revenue to make needed updates to the pool, grounds, perimeter fence, and street landscaping, much less support the construction of new courts. That can all change by the summer of 2023 or the year after. Allow me to share my personal vision:

I see a thriving community club – a year-round facility with active tennis and pickleball programs – that enhances our entire neighborhood for pool members and non-members alike.

This vision includes the addition of a new community space south of the pool for tennis, pickleball, and other recreational and social activities. A club or court membership would include full use of the new space and discounts on leagues, lessons, drills, and events. Non-members would not have open access to the court area but could still participate in programs by paying higher fees. This new community space will be available to all in some capacity.





Design Ideas for Completed Project - Phase 2

In addition, my vision includes pool and grounds improvements to feature a freshly resurfaced swimming pool, a new fence and updated landscaping along Mineral Ave, an updated playground area north of the pool, and improved landscaping on pool grounds.

A strong revenue stream will be built into the planning in order to ensure funds are available for full implementation of this project as well as on-going maintenance.

The development of a master plan, along with sufficient funds to implement it, will turn this vision into reality. **We must take one giant step to get it started.** That step is to build three post-tension concrete courts for tennis and pickleball, which will allow us to develop adult/youth tennis and pickleball programs, giving us a fresh source of revenue. Increased membership numbers will follow because we will have a club with year-round courts. Very preliminary response to this project has already resulted in new memberships.

After the courts and programs are up and running, the next step is to develop the designated pickleball court, along with social and recreational space at the east end of the courts.

What better place to spend a summer evening than the Foxridge Community Garden?

On June 26th the Foxridge Community Garden (FCG) celebrated the summer solstice. The summer solstice is known as a day in the summer, usually in June, that has more daylight than any other day of the year. But do you know why? The summer solstice, for the northern hemisphere, happens when the north pole is tilted more towards the sun than any other day of the year. It does not mean the earth is physically closer to the sun. As a result of the exaggerated tilt, we have more daylight than any other day of the year.

Many families, volunteers, neighbors, and gardeners enjoyed wine tasting hosted by Lukas Liquors, yummy and healthy appetizers, homemade popsicles, games and garden tours. 


Zal: "Hi La!! Did you know the FIA membership has almost reached last year's total? There are 406 members right now! Last year we had 407 at the end of the year."



A beautiful handicap accessible pathway now leads from the pool parking lot up to the raised garden bed area.

This remarkable project was completed efficiently and successfully by Eagle Scout candidate Trey Brauchler and his team of volunteers. It has made a huge impact on our garden. The very evening of completion, one of our community members brought his sister in her wheelchair to the Summer Solstice event at the garden. We were able to see firsthand the benefits this pathway will provide for years to come. In addition, the high quality of the path, efficiency of the construction, the number of volunteers, and the sourcing of materials all show great leadership skills by Trey. Here is a message from Trey:

My name is Trey Brauchler with Boy Scout Troop 373, and on June 25th, I completed my Eagle Scout Project for the garden handicap access pathway. We removed 400 sq ft of sod (that local residents picked up), dug out 4 cubic yards of dirt, installed 7.3 tons of crusher fines, and compacted for the final pathway. In addition to the handicap access pathway, we also installed a direct path from the new gate location to the picnic area.

We are excited about our next Eagle Scout project by Max Macca. Besides replacing the decaying fence between the parking lot and garden, Max and his team will build a raised bed on stilts for handicap accessibility.

The plan envisions an area where families may relax, socialize, play games, and watch their teammates or children compete.

So how do we get the courts built? Where does that money come from? A fundraising campaign is already underway with a goal of \$50,000 donated by Labor Day. Please check the website at foxridgeclub.com for current donation totals. All donations are deposited into a dedicated court account and will be returned if the project is not initiated.

Short-term Goal: Raise \$50,000 by Labor Day. This is the first step in a long-term fundraising plan.



August Landscape Update:

Your GID Funds at Work

By Martha Riley

Landscape Maintenance: Weed eradication, trash/debris cleanup and weekly maintenance continue.

Drive-Around: A drive-around on July 14th indicated several areas of need:

Maintenance: Extra weeding and cleanup, including the removal of dead shrubs and pruning the suckers on some trees will take place as soon as possible.

Tree Pruning: Trees along County Line Road, east and west of Niagara, and in the island at Holly and Otero need major pruning. Those areas were not included in the pruning job last fall since they are not along the GID fence. Maloney Tree Care LLC will do the work this fall.

Additional Landscaping: As time and budget allow, additional landscaping around the GID areas will be considered.

Sprinklers: Sprinklers have been adjusted and appear to be in good working order.

Fence Discoloration Issue: The local Trex district manager met with the corporate claims department the week of July 11th. He will compile a list of affected material to get a more accurate count. He is working with Split Rail Fence Company and a solution is on the horizon.

GID Project Manager Salary: Discussions with the City continue concerning the GID representative position. Walnut Hills has a project manager who is paid \$500 a month and a volunteer GID Representative who oversees the work and is the main communicator with the City. This scenario might be a good fit for Foxridge.

GID Budget Meeting and Fence Loan News: The GID representative met with City staff in mid July to discuss the 2023 budget. The 2023 ending fund balance is projected to be strong and the annual fund balance will likely continue to increase over the next few years. There is a possibility of paying off the 20-year fence loan a few years early, saving interest money. Also, residents would see their tax bills return to pre-construction levels (plus whatever percentage their home values have increased over that time).

 Weed and tree issues in South Suburban areas west of Monaco are becoming a problem. Visitor asked to contact SSPRD directly and will be supported by FIA. Potential city or covenant issue: people parking cars in their yards. Refer red this issue to our Covenant Advisor to investigate.

President's Report (M. Riley)

I hope everyone is keeping cool. I am thinking about turning all my wine into slush popsicles.

Kiddingkind of.

It's a waiting game in the vineyard right now, seeing how the grapes are coming along, keeping pests away and hoping for hot days and coolish nights. Canada had suffered a late frost and killed upwards to 80% in some vineyards. It will be a crop insurance year for many. In Chablis, Burgundy the same problem: late frosts. Smaller vineyards in France can do quick fixes like burning candles, make smudge pots (mini fires), and add wind machines to keep the air moving and prevent frost damage during bud set. It has become a bit of a problem as the shift in temperatures has created havoc on vineyards that were once guaranteed to produce. It's not that it hasn't happened, but the frequency is increasing and I predict this will increase the price of wine in the future.

Lukas Liquors Superstore came out and did a tasting of some great value wines at Summer Solstice in June at the Foxridge Community Garden. With price points under \$15 for the Chardonnay and Pinot Noir and a light white from Italy, these were some wines I hope you'll try for yourself!

Aragosta Vermentino Sardegna Italy

This wine 100% made from Vermentino grape grown on the coast of Alghero has wonderful acidity and is easy drinking

There is a picture of a lobster on the front, which you guessed it, the wine pairs well with shellfish!!! It was named in 100 wines for top value in 2019 and in 40 best value in the world which is a tall order! Get it at Lucas Liquors.

Le Versant Chardonnay 2019

It's a great introduction to Chardonnay it has subtle butter, oak, and vanilla and smooth on the palate.

Le Versant Pinot Noir 2019

I think, like its counterpart Chardonnay from this brand, it's subtle.

It has lovely, soft tannins, with hints of typical cherry and raspberry with overtones of soft oak to round out into an elegant finish. Both crowd pleasers!



From Growing Child.com comes this article that seems timely as back to school season is approaching:

SCHOOL SUCCESS

Here is some feedback from teachers in the early grades about some things you can do at home to ensure success for your children when they go off to school.

Their ideas may surprise you, since they don't involve academic knowledge or skills. Instead, they involve an assortment of attitudes and behaviors that support children's ability to participate well in classroom learning.

The first is the understanding that they cannot get what they want when they want it. Children need the ability to defer gratification, but many current parenting practices do not help them develop this. "I'm hungry" is not met with "Dinner will be in an hour" but with "Here are some cheese crackers."

When children's needs and wishes rule the day, they never learn to function under the stress of having to wait for something. And let's face it, unless kids have learned to wait, they are going to come up against problems in the classroom environment.

One thing you can do to foster this ability is to not fill every blank moment with technology when they're riding in cars or sitting in restaurants. Learning to occupy themselves mentally helps children extend their ability to wait.

Kind of related to this is the idea that children often come to school expecting that life is endless fun, with no dull moments. Today's parents are determined that their children have pleasure and excitement at every turn.

They fill every waking moment for their kids with enjoyable activities. Heaven forbid kids should utter the words, "I'm bored"; that would make parents believe they were not doing their job well, of keeping kids entertained.

The reality is that lots of things in life, in particular in school lives, are just plain not all that exciting. Think learning multiplication tables, spelling tests, studying for a science test.

So, teachers recommend that parents re-think the filling up of schedules,

the leaping to fill moments of tedium, tendency to make sure that children are always having a good time. In addition, being expected to do household chores, none of which are terribly exciting, allows children to experience doing something that must be done, whether it's fun or not.

If children have never done something they need to do, whether they like it or not, they are unlikely to do well in a setting where the teacher is not going to accept "I don't want to" as a response to, "Please take out your social studies book!"

One more thing that can prevent today's youngsters from succeeding

well in the classroom is limited social interaction with peers.

For a myriad of reasons, ranging from too much screen time to concerns about safety or parental regulation, kids today have not spent a lot of time in extended free play with children their own age.

It is only with this kind of interaction that children figure out the how of getting along with others--sharing space and materials, negotiating ideas and turns, learning the give and take that allows them to function confidently within a group. Providing opportunities for free play in the preschool years supports academic success.

What I'm basically saying is that school readiness involves many decisions you make concerning your children's social-emotional environment.

The ABC's and 1,2,3's are really simple to pick up later.

Modern Brew Adapts to Modern Times

When Ken and Kate Peterlin set out to open a coffee shop in Heritage Greens Plaza, they were hoping to establish a community gathering spot where neighbors could chat over a nice cup of coffee and a fresh pastry. They bought the end unit, formerly Menchie's Frozen

Yogurt, in August of 2019 and went to work painting over the purple, building a concrete bar, and setting up a kitchen.

Modern Brew opened its doors in December of 2019 and had a great start, however, in March of 2020 everything changed. The pandemic took a huge toll on many long-standing small businesses in the community, and the Peterlins know first-hand the unique obstacles business-owners faced during 2020-2021. Instead of focusing primarily on being a coffee shop, the family decided to broaden the offerings of their restaurant; including to-go family dinners. You could still swing by and grab a latte and a muffin on your way to work, but you could now join your friends for a beer or two on the patio or take a hot dinner home to your family.

When restrictions started to lift in Spring of 2021, Modern Brew partnered with the Warrior Bonfire Program to host their first ever Vetstock. This weekend-long live music event takes place over Memorial Day weekend and raises money for Purple Heart Veterans in our community, and in 2021, Modern Brew helped raise \$5,000.

From Vetstock 2021, Modern Brew was able to maintain that momentum; by adding weekend brunch, live music, trivia, dinner specials, spirit pairings, open mic nights, and DIY workshops to their lineup of events, they were able to provide something for everyone. When Vetstock 2022 came around, Modern Brew featured a menu of BBQ foods and menu favorites, along with beer from local breweries like Halfpenny, St. Patrick's, and Lariat Lodge.

Play tennis, live longer?

A study reported on the Mayo Clinic website indicates that tennis players live markedly longer lives than sedentary people and people who participate in any other athletic activity.

In 2019, Danish scientists found that people who played tennis added an average of 9.7 years to their lives over those who were sedentary, compared to 3.7 years for cyclists, 3.2 for joggers, and 1.5 for those who worked out in health clubs.

Title: Various Leisure-Time Physical Activities Associated With Widely Divergent Life Expectancies: The Copenhagen City Heart Study

Date: Sept 4, 2018

Objective: To evaluate the differential improvements in life expectancy associated with participation in various sports.

Patients and Methods: The Copenhagen City Heart Study (CCHS) is a prospective population study that included detailed questionnaires regarding participation in different types of sports and leisure-time physical activity. The 8577 participants were followed for up to 25 years for all-cause mortality from their examination between October 10, 1991, and September 16, 1994, until March 22, 2017. Relative risks were calculated using Cox proportional hazards models with full adjustment for confounding variables.

Results:

Multivariable-adjusted life expectancy gains compared with the sedentary group for different sports were as follows: tennis, 9.7 years; badminton, 6.2 years; soccer, 4.7 years; cycling, 3.7 years; swimming, 3.4 years; jogging, 3.2 years; calisthenics, 3.1 years; and health club activities, 1.5 years.

Conclusion: Various sports are associated with markedly different improvements in life expectancy. Because this is an observational study, it remains uncertain whether this relationship is causal. Interestingly, the leisure-time sports that inherently involve more social interaction were associated with the best longevity—a finding that warrants further investigation.


