The FIA is still 40 memberships short of being able to fund our final events of the year: Foxtales postage, Dumpster Day+, and the Holiday Carriage Ride.


Additionally, the Little Free Library at Foxridge Park needs to be replaced, which will cost around \$400—that's just seven memberships!

Final Fall Cleanup: A Gift to Your Yard and Your Peace of Mind

As November settles in and the days grow shorter, it's time for one last round of fall cleanup before winter takes hold. Tackling these final tasks now not only keeps your yard looking tidy, but also sets the stage for a healthier landscape come spring—and saves you time and stress down the road.

Why It Matters: A good cleanup isn't just about curb appeal. Fallen leaves, overgrown perennials, and leftover debris can smother your lawn, invite pests, and create mold or fungus issues during the damp winter months. By taking care of these items now, you're helping your yard "breathe" through winter and recharge for spring growth.

What to Focus On:

- Leaf Removal: Rake or mulch fallen leaves to prevent matting that blocks air and sunlight from your grass. Shredded leaves can be added to garden beds or compost for rich organic matter.

- **Final Lawn Care:** Mow one last time (on a slightly lower setting) and consider a late-season fertilizer to strengthen roots before frost.
- Garden Prep: Pull annuals, clean up vegetable beds, and add a layer of mulch to protect soil and perennials from freezing.
- Outdoor Maintenance: Drain and store hoses, shut off sprinklers, clean gutters, and tidy tools—little things that prevent big problems later.

The Bonus Benefit: Peace of Mind! There's something deeply satisfying about heading into winter knowing your outdoor spaces are cared for and ready for rest. A final fall cleanup creates a sense of order before the holidays and frees you from springtime surprises like clogged gutters, patchy lawns, or overgrown garden beds.

So bundle up, grab your rake or blower, and give your yard a proper send-off for the season. Come March, you'll thank yourself when the first green shoots appear in a yard that's ready to thrive. Note: Extra unwanted or broken tools/lawn furniture can be disposed of at Fall Dumpster Day!!! Thanks to the hardwork of our FIA board and paying dues members. See you there. - There are 3 seats up for election in this year's election for the Board of Directors
- There are no ballot issues to be decided in this year's election.
- Election for Board of Directors positions are not subject to quorum requirements. The candidates receiving the most votes cast will be elected for a two-year term.
- Candidates must be an Owner of Record of a Lot within the eleven filings known as Foxridge and must also be a member of the Association, both conditions effective as of the record date of November 12, 2025.
- The eligibility of write-in candidates must be verified by the FIA Secretary before the election results can be determined.
- Ballots must include the member's address of a Foxridge Lot and be properly signed to be accepted. The FIA Secretary or his designee(s) will verify membership and address before the results are certified as final.

Instructions to Voters: Each household is allowed one vote and must be an FIA member to vote. See the list of eligible voting addresses on page 15. It's not too late to pay your \$60 annual fee. Go to foxridgeclub.com and click on Membership to join before 7pm on Wednesday, November 12th.




I currently work as a communications manager in the IT Department at Colorado School of Mines. Before that, I led email and content marketing for Movement Climbing gyms. My



South Metro Fire Rescue is partnering with Arapahoe County Sheriff's Office as a distribution center for the Blue Envelope Program, which began Oct. 1, 2025.

The "Blue Envelope Program" in Colorado is a voluntary, free program offered by multiple law enforcement agencies to support safer interactions between individuals, especially those with disabilities or communication barriers like autism, dementia, or hearing impairments, and public safety personnel. Participants can store important documents like their driver's license, vehicle registration, and communication preferences in a blue envelope to provide officers with crucial information, fostering clearer communication and enhancing safety during encounters. The program is self-managed, requiring no registration or personal information, and is designed to reduce stress and prevent misunderstandings by providing officers with immediate context about a person's needs.

Community members can pick up Blue Envelope materials at the front desk of South Metro Fire Rescue Headquarters, 9195 E Mineral Ave., during regular business hours 7:30 AM- 4:30 PM weekdays.
