

Building Community in Foxridge for a Greener Tomorrow

Foxridge is becoming greener each year and the FIA works to find and promote environmentally friendly practices.

Here are some examples:

- Recycle/reuse the plastic easter eggs used during the Easter Egg Hunt
- Shred-It Event on April 29 (thank you to our sponsors Julie Holt, Keith Zaring, Travis Henderson!)
- Two Goodwill trucks and six dumpsters at Dumpster Day #1 on June 10th (must be FIA member)
- A shredder or e-recycling truck at Dumpster Day #2 (if funds allow the event and must be member)
- Yard waste composting event in November (date TBD) (must be FIA member)
- City of Centennial chipping and mulch event on Sat, May 6th
- NextDoor, Facebook Marketplace, Craig's List, FreeCycle and others offer ways to sell or give away usable items

Recycling, giving away or selling reusable items not only keeps our dumpsters from filling up too quickly (we will only have 6 in June), it keeps items out of the landfill. We're very excited to offer two Goodwill trucks on June 6, one for furniture and fragile items and one for rugs, etc. You can find a list of acceptable/prohibited items in this issue of *Foxtales* on **page 10**. The Foxridge Community Garden continues to use sustainable and organic practices. Lastly, the Girl Scouts in the neighborhood worked very hard to educate residents about yard waste's negative impacts on the environment and how to turn it into usable compost via Lone Tree Composting. As a result, some of our Foxridge residents now use Lone Tree Composting on a regular basis. Through Foxridge's community efforts we can continue to find sustainable solutions together for a greener future. Landscape Maintenance: Spring cleanup is beginning.

Fence Discoloration Issue: The Trex materials are expected to be shipped to the Denver distributor soon and work should begin later this spring or early summer to repair the fence. Trex will reclaim all of the discarded materials to be recycled at their manufacturing plant. Please see the maps below to view the expected areas of remediation (subject to slight changes). The official schedule of repairs will be shared with affected residents when available.

Representatives from the fence company will also go door-to-door with pertinent information whenever fence construction is imminent.



Natural Neighbors

Cottonwood Tree

Soon our local cottonwoods will be starting to leaf out and produce catkins. These important trees to wildlife, water quality and our shaded walkways are also fascinating.

- A single tree can use between 50-200 gallons of water a day. They release that water as vapor through transpiration, which helps cool the air.
- Break open a dropped twig at a large node (bump) and see if you can find the star hidden inside. You may have to try a few. Some legends say that when the wind blows, causing a twig to break, a star is sent up to the sky.



The "cotton" seeds are only produced by female trees. The male ones
produce pollen, which fertilize the flowers (in dangling catkins) that
produce the cotton.



Foxridge Girl Scouts Silver Project - Composting Day

Did you know throwing away yard waste is bad for the environment? Neither did we! You might be wondering who we are. We are the 8th Grade Girl Scout Troop 65594 with several members and leaders living in the Foxridge neighborhood since our troop started in 1st grade. In June of 2022, we posted an article educating the neighborhood about composting and tips to keep your grass healthy. Hopefully you were able to use some of those tips last summer.

In case you missed the article, our troop was working on earning the Girl Scout Silver Award, which is one of the highest awards a Girl Scout Cadette can achieve. We were tasked with finding an issue that we are passionate about and a sustainable solution for this issue to make a lasting impact in our community. Through our research we discovered that a large issue in many neighborhoods is inappropriate disposal of yard waste. We talked with a handful of composting companies and decided to partner with Lone Tree Composting to move our project forward. We came up with a composting day in our local community.

During the Foxridge Fair, we reserved a booth to inform people about our composting project and talked about how it was accessible through FIA memberships. Composting Day is a lot like the biannual Dumpster Day – just for plants instead of couches – and just as accessible with a membership.

Composting Day is an annual event that takes place in November. We had our first Composting Day last year and it was a smashing success. The purpose of this day is to help stop the flow of biodegradable waste from going into landfills. Examples of biodegradable waste include a wide variety of plants like trees, leaves, vegetable/flower parts, straw, grass clipping, weeds, twigs and small branches. When plants decompose in landfills instead of getting composted, it adds CO2 into the air and adds many chemicals to rivers and springs, making it unhealthy to live around.

Now that it is 2023, we are in our very final stretch of the award and that is community outreach. We were challenged to make a sustainable event. In February, the FIA (Foxridge Improvement

Association) approved a Composting Day and added it to the budget. If you are interested in paying a small \$60 fee for a membership, the FIA will welcome you with open arms, and if you are a long-time member that needs to renew your membership, welcome back!

If you are wondering how you can prepare yourself for our November Composting Day, here are some ways you can do that:

- Start collecting your yard waste in 30-gallon paper compostable yard waste bags.
 - Include leaves, vegetable and flower plant parts, straw, grass clippings, weeds, twigs and small branches that can fit in the bags.
 - Woody twigs and branches that are greater than 1/4 inch in diameter should first be put through a shredder-chipper.


