### **Foxridge Community Garden News**

Here's the Latest News! The Foxridge Community Garden, located next to the Club at Foxridge, welcomes you! Feel free to stop by when the garden is open and join us during our annual Summer Solstice Open House on Saturday, June 17 from 6 to 8:30 pm. **Garden Bed Rentals Available:** We have two smaller beds that are 6'x4' and one larger bed (12'x4') available. They are constructed of untreated cedar and filled with a blend of screened topsoil and plant-based compost. Water is included. You provide the plants and seeds and maintain the bed.

There are several renting options: You can rent a full 12' x 4' raised bed and garden to your heart's content. The cost for a full bed is \$100, which includes water. Half-beds are \$50.00.

**Volunteering:** Eager to support the garden, but not sure about your schedule or green thumb? Donation beds are available on a case-by-case basis depending on volunteer availability. With a donation

bed, you pay the full bed fees outlined above and plant what you'd like, but FCG volunteers maintain the bed. Produce will be enjoyed by the donation bed renter, garden volunteers and donated to area food banks.

The large trees in the east end of the garden have been pruned for safety and aesthetics. Many thanks to two of our dedicated volunteers for their leadership and generosity! Their leadership made the project happen and their sizeable donation allowed the garden to afford it.

**Special thanks** to Max Macca for repairing the broken landscape tie along the sidewalk in front of the garden. With this and the new fence installation, including our unique gate, he has completed his Eagle Scout requirements. -congrats!

# Foxridge Hero - Wendy Barnard

Wendy, a ten-year resident of Foxridge and her big white shepherd, Bode, walked the trails and paths around our community until his passing. Wendy needed several doggie poop bags to clean up after Bode and it bothered her that she, and all the other dog walkers, were using the black, non-degradable bags provided by South Suburban Park and Recreation District (SSPRD).



We dog walkers are all grateful that SSPRD does a good job of providing dispensers, bags and trash cans to deal with dog waste, but Wendy took another step. In August of 2021, she called the District to inquire if they were using biodegradable bags. They weren't, and Wendy asked if they would consider making a switch to biodegradable bags if a suitable option could be found to meet their needs. She also learned they have a massive composting facility that could accommodate the poop bags, saving them from going to a landfill.

Wendy searched for and called compostable bag suppliers from Canada to Florida, sending them photos of our existing dispensers. The quantity of bags needed by the District runs into the hundreds of thousands. Wendy shared her findings with the District.

For a long time, it seemed nothing was going to come from her efforts until just recently, green bags started appearing in the poop bag dispensers. "I almost started crying when I saw the first green bags", said Wendy.

Wendy is now walking her new dog, Briar, along the trails and watching other dog walkers using the biodegradable bags. All of us who use the trails, on foot, bikes, scooters, with and without dogs have Wendy to thank for recognizing a need, taking the time to pursue it and making our corner of the planet a little cleaner and greener. Thanks, Wendy! Woof!

Poo Free Parks is now the vendor for our biodegradable poop bags. If you choose to purchase bags from them (PooFreeParks.com), 10% of sales are donated to the Colorado Pet Pantry.



**Landscape Maintenance:** Spring cleanup and weed eradication are underway and sprinklers will be turned on as appropriate. Thank you to Jim Arneill for sprucing up the Mineral Ave. gardens.

**GID Representative and Project Manager:** City Staff has recommended Tudi Arneill for the position of Foxridge GID representative. The appointment was approved by the FGID Board of Directors at the Board meeting held on April 18.

The deadline for Project Manager letters of interest was April 15. After interviews, City Staff will make a recommendation to the Board.

**GID Fence Discoloration Repairs:** Details should be coming out soon about the specific plans for fence work and repairs should begin soon after that. The official schedule of repairs will be shared with affected residents when available.

# Barbecue and Wine Pairings

Spring is finally here, thank goodness. I usually head back to Canada to help with the vineyard, but this year, vine tying will be done in one day with a crew of people. My nephew will be the third family member getting married on the farm. Everything is getting done sooner rather than later! We made some of the wine for the wedding last year for the barbecue feast, which included some Pinots and red blends. I'm looking forward to tasting those in the barrels in late spring.

Spring is all about tidying and getting things ready for the warmer weather to come. Dusting off the barbecue grill, filling the Traeger with wood pellets or getting all your firewood for open fire cooking (trending right now) are on the task list. Now that we are ready to cook something on the fire, what wines go with barbecue?

Wine and food pairing has become somewhat complicated. We don't eat foods separately. At a barbecue, we have many side dishes and sauces, which tend to be a bit more important than the actual item being barbecued. In parts of the world where fire cooking is traditional, like Argentina and South Africa, we enjoy the Malbecs and red blends. You want to look more at the sauce you are serving. Herbal butter, sweet barbecue sauce, garlic driven or spicy – they all affect the wine much more than the meat.

### A little science

Garlic and chili both do the same to our taste receptors. They signal heat and pain receptors in your mouth and your taste buds can't handle anything but recognizing tannin. A fruity or slight sparkling wine will help distract that sensation. So, if you are heavy on the spice and garlic, it really doesn't matter because your taste buds feel under attack, so go with a sparkling rose or lighter bodied, slightly chilled red! This is also why beer works great. That sparkling cold beer helps calm our taste buds!

### Can I have a white wine with barbecue?

Yes! If you are having a cream-based sauce, then head for chardonnay. If it is herby, then a white from Italy will do nicely!

### Food trick

I haven't tried this trick, but if you want to drink a white wine with a steak, then squeeze a bit of lemon on your steak, and it will match with the acidity in the wine!



INGREDIENTS

- 1 pound asparagus, preferably thin
- 4 cloves garlic
- 1 medium lemon
- 1 ounce Parmesan cheese (1/2 cup firmly packed freshly grated or 1/3 cup store-bought grated), plus more for serving
- 1 pound dried spaghetti or other long pasta, such as linguine or bucatini
- 4 tablespoons olive oil, divided
- 1 1/2 teaspoons kosher salt, divided
- 1/4 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
- 1/4 teaspoon red pepper flakes (optional)
- Fresh basil leaves, for serving (optional)

### **Lemon Asparagus Pasta Recipe**

Serves 4-6 | From: thekitchn.com

### INSTRUCTIONS

- Bring a large pot of salted water to a boil. Trim 1 pound asparagus and cut crosswise on a slight diagonal into 1 1/2-inch pieces (about 3 cups). Mince 4 garlic cloves. Finely grate the zest of 1 medium lemon (about 1 tablespoon). Juice the lemon until you have 3 tablespoons. Finely grate 1 ounce Parmesan cheese (about 1/2 packed cup) or measure out 1/3 cup store-bought grated.
- Add 1 pound dried pasta to the boiling water and cook 1 minute less than al dente, about 9 minutes or according to package instructions. Meanwhile, cook the asparagus.
- Heat 3 tablespoons of the olive oil in a large skillet over medium heat until shimmering. Add the asparagus, 1 teaspoon of the kosher salt, 1/4 teaspoon black pepper, and 1/4 teaspoon red pepper flakes if using. Sauté until the asparagus is bright green and crisp-tender, 3 to 4 minutes. Add the garlic and sauté until fragrant, about 1 minute. Remove from heat and stir in the lemon zest and lemon juice.
- Reserve 1 cup of the pasta water, then drain the pasta. Return the skillet to medium heat and add the pasta, remaining 1/2 teaspoon kosher salt, and reserved pasta water. Cook, tossing and stirring the pasta, until the pasta is all dente and almost all of the pasta water is absorbed, 1 to 2 minutes.
- Remove the pan from the heat. Add the Parmesan and remaining 1 tablespoon olive oil, and toss to combine. Serve garnished with more grated Parmesan and torn fresh basil leaves if desired.
