
Yay!! It's June and summer is almost (officially) here. 2

Natural Veighbors

Hummingbirds

Want to attract hummingbirds to your yard? Try these tips:

- Plant tube-shaped showy flowers, especially Colorado natives like scarlet gilia, fireweeds, mints, columbines, larkspurs, and penstemons. Honeysuckle, salvia and bee balm attract the birds as well.
- If putting out feeders, use 1 part white sugar to 4 parts water. (Dissolve sugar in boiling water and let cool). Avoid dyes and commercial foods. Clean feeders every 3-4 days to prevent mold.
- Keep cats indoors!
- It may take a while for the birds to discover your yard; keep it up and they will come and remember it in future years.

INTERESTING INFO: The Rainbow Squirrel

- 1. The Rainbow Squirrel really does exist in India. It is also known as the Malabar Giant Squirrel. This "radiant rodent" weighs between 2 and 3 pounds, about the same as a small chihuahua. It can grow to 36 inches long from head to tip of tail. It builds nests on thin branches in tall trees to avoid predators. It can leap up to 18 feet between tree branches. It caches nuts and seeds in trees, not on or in the ground. It rarely leaves the trees. It lives in tropical deciduous and moist evergreen forests and woodlands. It can have a three-toned color scheme and the colors vary depending on the subspecies. Predators include birds of prey and leopards. It eats fruit, flowers, nuts, tree bark, some insects and bird eggs.
- 2. In the human recruiting world, the "purple squirrel" is the candidate who is the perfect fit for the job, one who has all the "must" and "good to have" qualities, skills, education, and qualifications.
- 3. The Raccoon Squirrel is a type of Eastern Fox Squirrel that has a black face mask.

- 6. Black squirrels come about 1 in 10,000 squirrels.

Green Goddess Cobb Salad

This Whole30, keto, and gluten free Green Goddess Cobb Salad, a Panera Bread copycat recipe, is the healthy and satisfying entree salad of your dreams!



Ingredients:

For the salad

- ½ cup Green Goddess Dressing
- 1 large head of romaine lettuce chopped up into bite-sized pieces
- 6 bacon slices cooked and crumbled
- 2 small Hass avocados peeled, pitted, and cubed
- 1 pound leftover cooked chicken shredded or cut into bite-sized pieces
- 1 cup cherry or grape tomatoes halved
- 4 hard boiled eggs peeled and halved
- ½ cup Quick Pickled Red Onions
- Diamond Crystal kosher salt
- Freshly ground black pepper

For the dressing (blend the following)

- ½ medium avocado pitted and peeled
- ½ cup Italian parsley leaves

- ½ cup fresh basil leaves
- ¼ cup chopped chives
- 1 small garlic clove
- ¾ cup extra virgin olive oil
- ½ cup water, orplus more if needed
- ½ cup freshly squeezed lemon juice
- 2 tablespoons tahini
- 1 teaspoon Diamond Crystal kosher salt
- ¼ teaspoon Freshly ground black pepper

For the pickled red onions

Combine the following and set in fridge for at least 30 minutes:

- ½ cup apple cider vinegar or rice vinegar
- ¼ cup apple juice
- ½ teaspoon Diamond Crystal kosher salt
- 1 medium red onion thinly sliced

Directions:

- 1. Grab or make a jar of Green Goddess Dressing. Measure out a half cup of it.
- 2. Place the chopped romaine leaves on the bottom of a large salad bowl.
- 3. Top the lettuce with the salad ingredients (bacon, avocado, chicken, tomatoes, eggs, and pickled onions) in individual rows to make things pretty!
- 4. Season the salad with salt and pepper. Serve with the Green Goddess Dressing!




